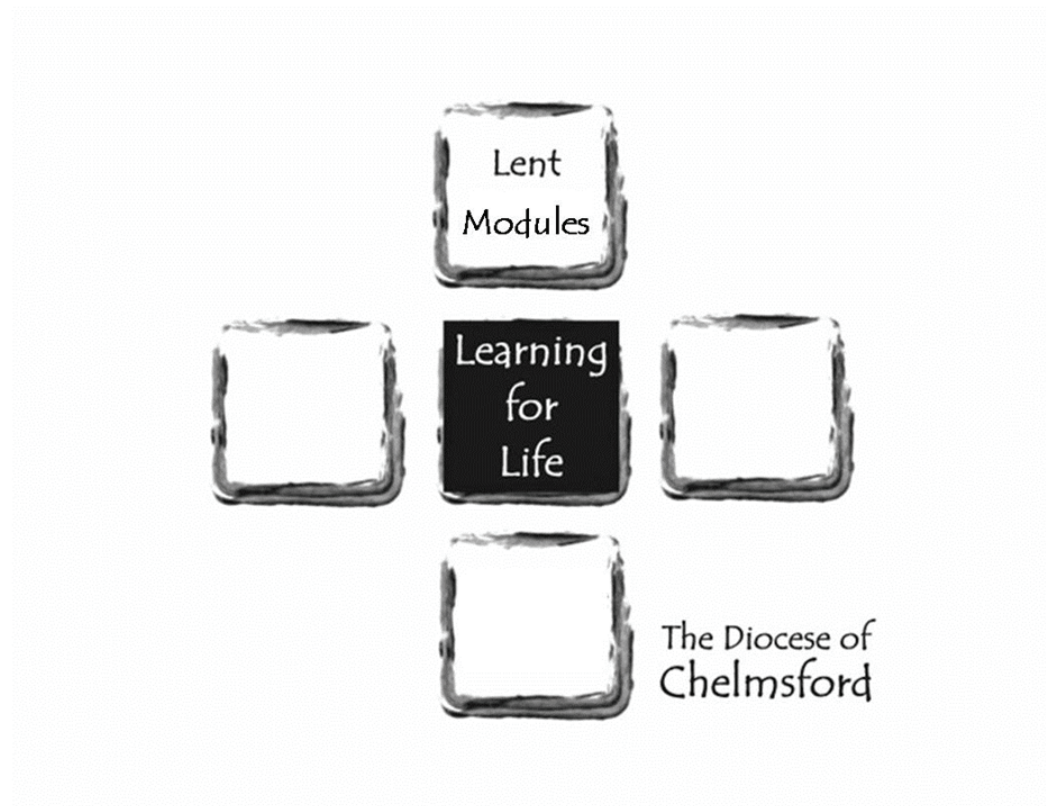

Lent Modules

Module Lent 1 The Church, the Enlightenment and Revolution

The Peace of Westphalia 1648 brought an end to the religious warfare between the states of Europe. However, religious differences continued within those states while in the 18th century the Church, Catholic and Protestant, faced new challenges of the growth of science, the Enlightenment and political and economic revolution.

COURSE CONTENT includes:-

- Week 1 The Peace of Westphalia: the success of the Counter Reformation.
Religious policies in France and Britain in the late 17th century.
- Week 2 The "Ancien Regime ": the Enlightenment and the Enlightened Despots.
- Week 3 Economic revolutions in England and their effects on the Church.
The American Revolution and a secular Constitution
- Week 4 The Revolution in France.
- Week 5 Napoleon, his religious policy and the "Code Napoleon".
The Church in Britain and Europe in 1815.

Module Lent 7
“W@W” - Witnessing in the World of Work
equipping effective everyday evangelism

PURPOSE

W@W aims to investigate the theory and practice of active Christian witness in today's workplace. Its purpose is to better equip Christian witness in an agnostic and atheist atmosphere, and in one where witness involves interaction with other active faith systems.

COURSE CONTENT includes:-

Week One will investigate being a Christian in the workplace – why witness in the workplace, what is witness, the barriers to witness, ethical challenges in the workplace, and witness without words. Week Two will develop worldly-wise witnessing, investigating approaches to those of different beliefs and how those beliefs affect thinking and behaviour, examining differences and similarities between Christian belief and those of Agnostics and Atheists, Jews and Muslims, and Sikhs and Hindus in order to facilitate greater understanding and more effective witness.

St Paul tells us to pray constantly. That is easier said than done and not at all as easy as it sounds. The course will be experiential i.e. of a more practical nature, involving some prayer and aims at exploring, and recognising, what can trigger prayer in daily life. For example, 'looking' is not the same as 'seeing'. Previous courses from Linda on prayer have been about how to pray, and perhaps about what to pray. This one is almost all about motivation to pray. To prime something is to set it ready to work. Being primed for prayer could be useful.

Through Essex Source.

This is a chance to study in more depth the social and economic as well as theological impact the reformation had on English History from Essex sources.

It will also be a chance to look at primary source material and develop critical skills in reflection and analysis.

The growth of urbanization as a critical challenge to the mission of the church. The development of secularization and the churches response to this growing concern. Through the personalities and event, we will plot the journey the church took in the nineteenth century to ask where we are today.

The Gospel of Christ and the Expansion of Human Consciousness

The New Testament seems to have arisen out of an unprecedented experience of human vitality among those who believed that they had encountered, submitted to, and were living in the power of, the crucified and risen Christ. While we encounter many examples of such vitality among modern Christians, it is far from the norm. Much modern Christianity is either dull and conformist, or makes a great play of a vitality which is in reality subject to some pretty rigid rules.

In this course, we will use Scripture and theological reflection to seek to uncover this vitality, and try to be honest about our own personal experience, including where we have got stuck, to try to make the vitality more our own.'
