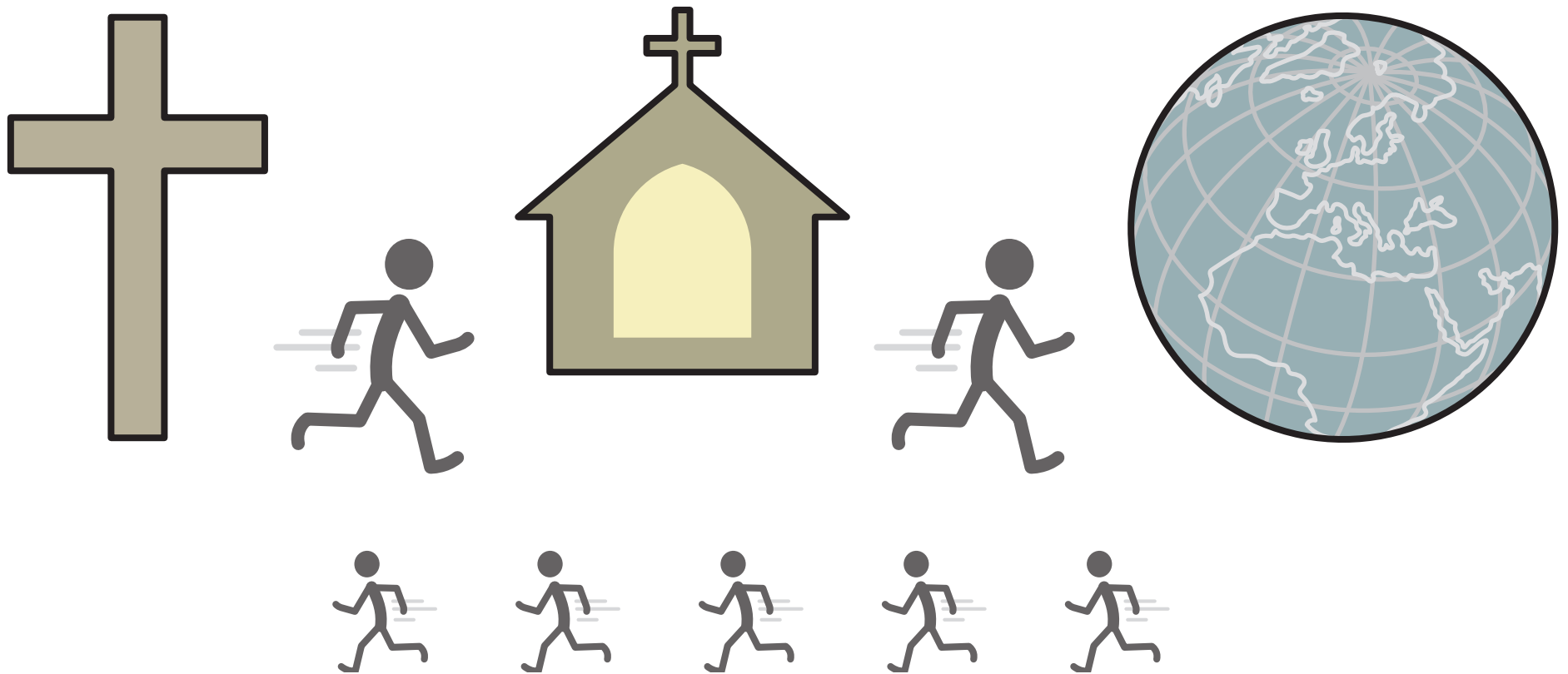

Aims to help the Church become a transforming presence in our community...



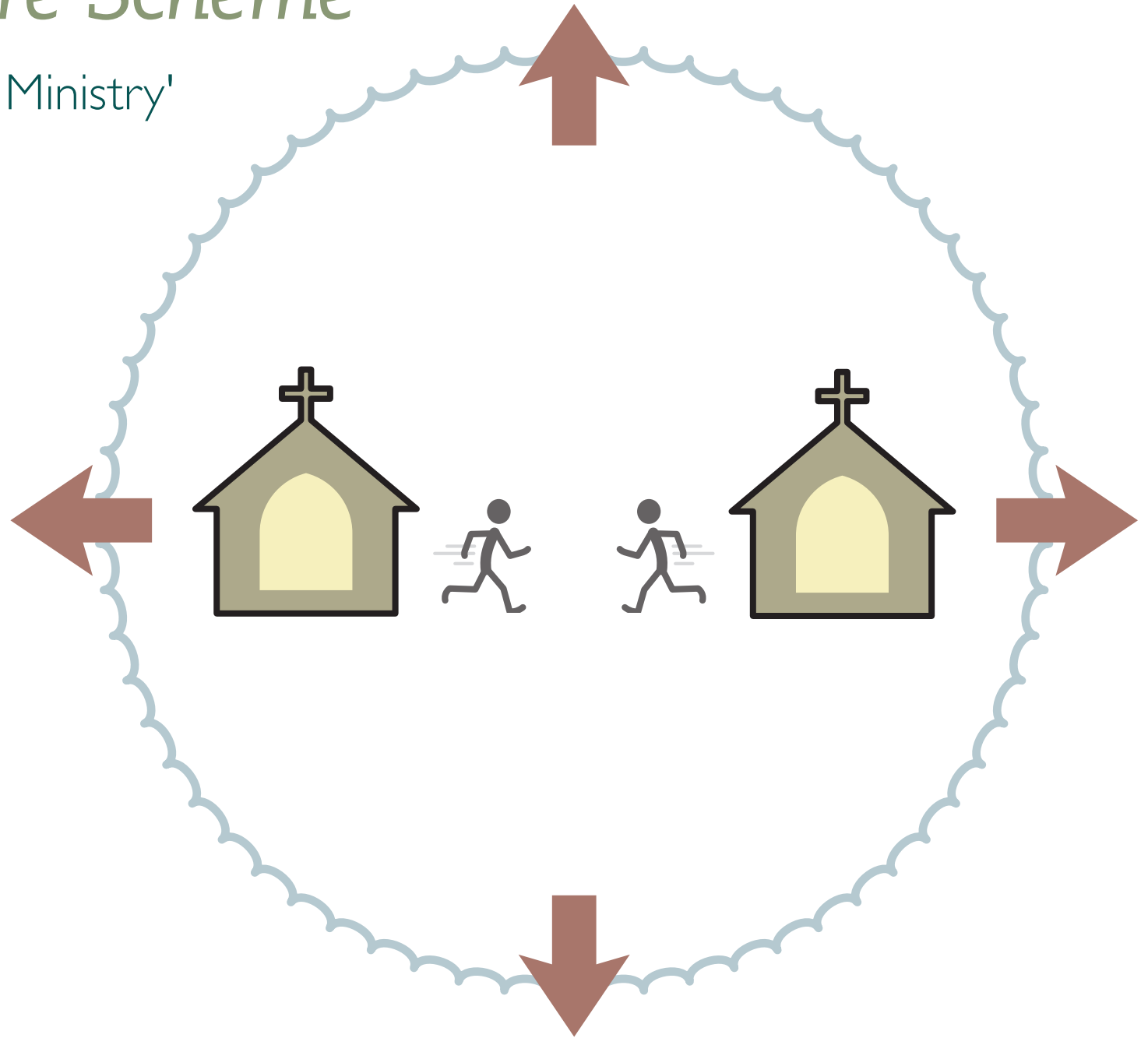

Supports 'Re-imagining Ministry'

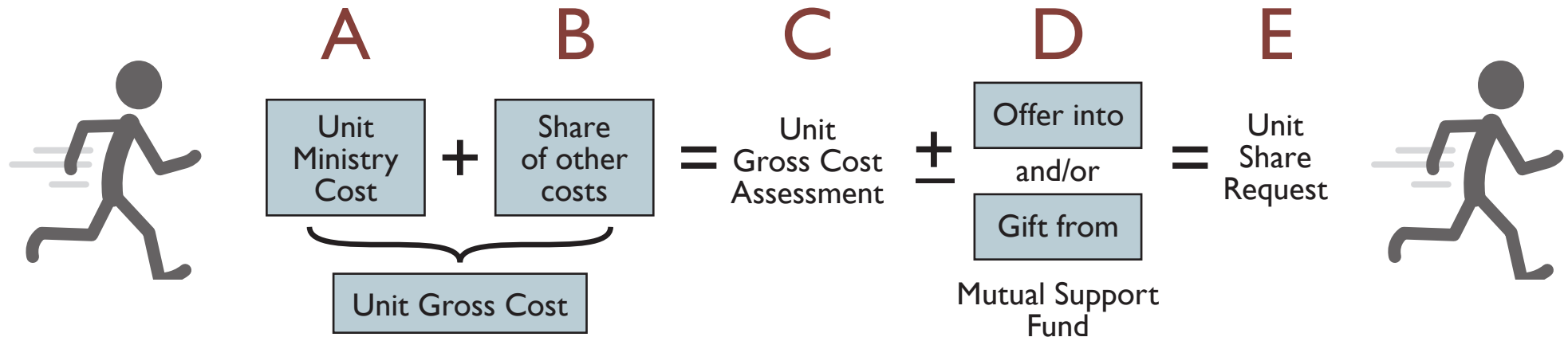
Is rooted in prayer,

The new Share Scheme

Works like this -



The Mission & Ministry Unit or Benefice:

- Will see the costs of ministry, training future ministry and other services.
- Will either pledge to the Mutual Support Fund for helping local mission or make an 'ask' from this Fund.

The Mutual Support Fund starts with £5 M which is there to be used.

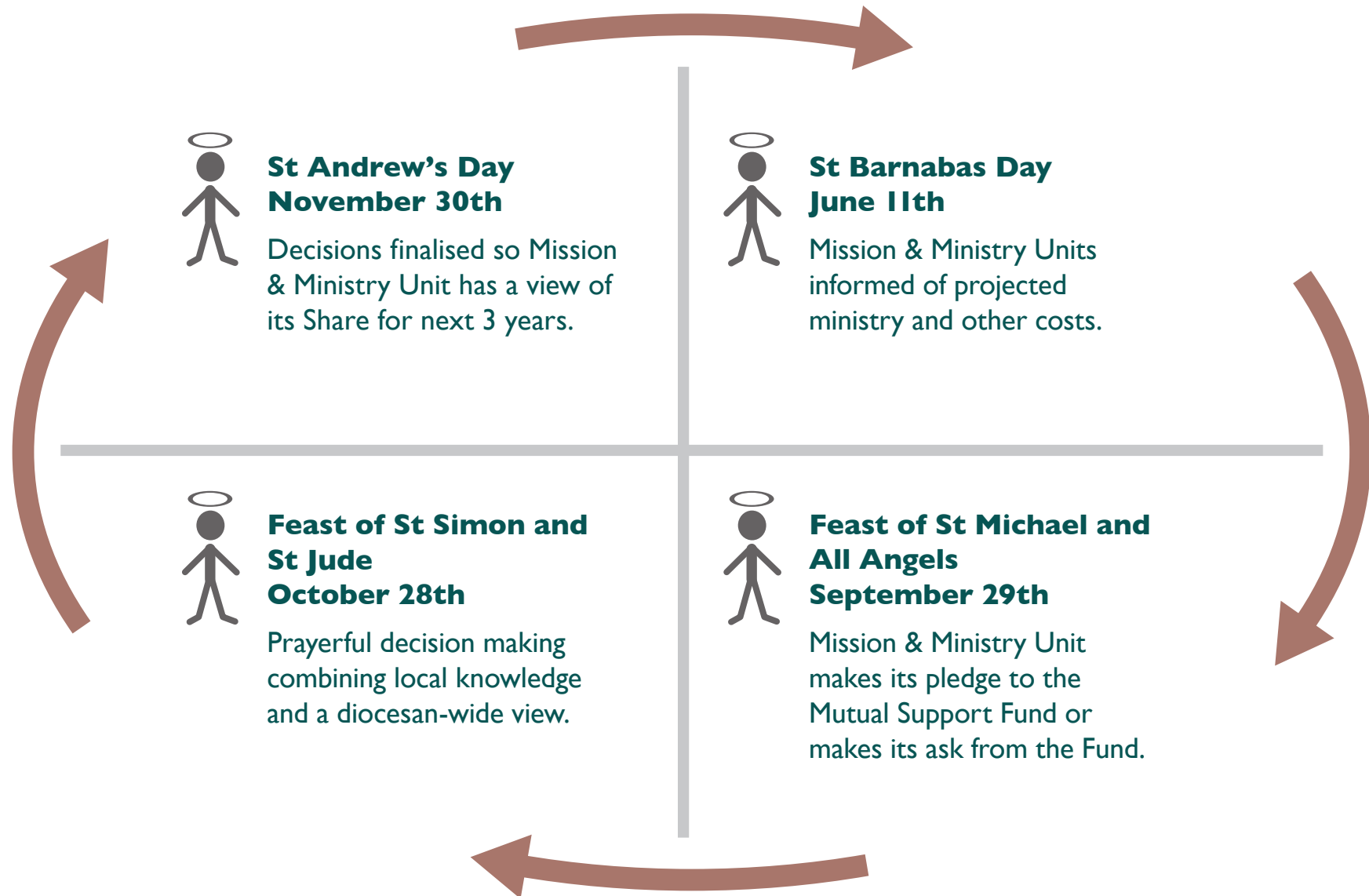
