



## Resurrection Journeys

*A reflection from The Very Revd Dr Jessica Martin, The Dean of Chelmsford:*

Way back in the time of St Cedd, Christians had a name for the practice of setting out into the unknown. They called it peregrinatio – which meant 'leaving one's homeland and wandering for the love of God'. It was travelling in faith to who knows what, who knows where – understanding you might never come back, that you would be changed by the journey.

St Cedd himself undertook peregrinatio when he left all that he knew to venture into the strange land of Essex.

Scripture is full of wandering. Abraham left all that he knew in Haran. Jesus was 'driven out' into the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry. The apostles found that their faith sent them wandering, taking the good news of Jesus beyond the familiar worlds they knew.

And our own journeys of faith take us to unexpected places. These are the 'resurrection journeys' of our lives, and we pray to travel upon them well together.

During Lent, we embark together on our 100 Days of Prayer, part of the wider discernment

within Sustaining Ministry as we ask God where he calls this diocese. Its presiding scripture is the Emmaus journey (Luke 24.13-35), a road that is both a road of uncertainty and loss (those travelling it are mourning Jesus's death) and a resurrection road (he is walking alongside them all the time). So it is both a wilderness road and a resurrection journey.

This Lent, as we discern our communal way, we also walk in a wilderness of difficult times and uncertain futures.

Yet at the same time we walk towards and alongside the light and joy of Jesus's resurrection, the one who accompanies us even when we do not know it, and who opens up the Word until our hearts burn with joy and purpose.

# DRAW NEAR

LIFE-GIVING HABITS FOR LENT



The Church of England's theme for Lent 2026 is Draw Near: Life-giving habits for Lent.

This year's resources have at their heart the theme of a 'rhythm of life' – habits and patterns which help us grow as disciples of Christ day by day, especially as we prepare to celebrate the great mystery of God's saving love at Easter.

The resources include weekly reflections centred around a summary of the Christian Way from Common Worship, which identifies six activities essential to our calling as disciples.

Each week a different contributor explores a different aspect of Christian discipleship. The Dean of Chelmsford, the Very Revd Dr Jessica Martin, has written the reflection on sharing communion. Other themes for the reflections include – worshipping together, praying, exploring the Bible, offering service and sharing the good news with others.

These reflections are part of a wide range of resources to help churches and individuals join in with the Lent theme if they wish.

They are available in a printed booklet, people can sign up to receive them via email and

they are available on the Church of England's Everyday Faith App, social media channels and website.

A parallel 40-day challenge booklet for families and children is also available - exploring the life-giving habit of generosity in partnership with 40acts.

## St Christopher's revive the commemoration of the 1953 North Sea flood

On Sunday 1 February St Christopher's, Jaywick revived the village's commemoration service for the floods of 1953.

The service, led by the Vicar, Fr Matt Simpkins, drew over a hundred people: the church's largest congregation for many years.

Reflecting on the service, Fr Matt said: "We were overwhelmed by the response to the commemoration service. With so many people attending, extra mugs and chairs had to be sourced after the service began!

"The Flood of 1953 was a moment that shaped Jaywick's character. Its famous spirit of mutual help and community in part grew from the assistance Jaywick people gave to each other on that night in which 5% of the village's population was killed. The service was a wonderful opportunity to rededicate ourselves to a hope-filled future for Jaywick, shaped by mutual care and a richness of community that any place in England would benefit from."

The 1953 floods claimed the lives of 5% of Jaywick's population at the time, and a memorial was established in St Christopher's Church.

At the service a number of survivors of the tragedy shared their stories and others helped to light the memorial candle. Following a minute's silence, the names of those who died were read.

Memories were shared over refreshments after the service.

Among the honoured guests were Nigel Spencer MBE, Deputy Lieutenant to the Lord Lieutenant of Essex; Cllr Bill Davidson, Chair of Tendring District Council; Carlo Bardetti, Lifeboat Operations Manager, Clacton RNLI Lifeboat Station; and the Rt Revd Roger Morris, the Bishop of Colchester, who preached the sermon.

Following the service, Nigel Spencer MBE wrote to the parish, commenting, "It was a privilege to chat to so many residents, guest and church members. The whole atmosphere was upbeat positive and friendly."

## Growing Together in Boreham

Since 2024, St Andrew’s Church in Boreham has shared its services, on the second Sunday of each month, with Word Alive Chapel, a Pentecostal congregation within the Redeemed Christian Church of God that normally meets at Boreham Village Hall. Most joint services take place at St Andrew’s, with one memorable open-air “Songs of Praise” held outside (pictured).

In January, members of the Word Alive Leadership Team and the St Andrew’s wardens met with Boreham’s interim minister, the Revd Andy Griffiths, for an evening of conversation and hopeful planning.

Andy explains: “Much of the discussion focused on appreciating each church’s distinctive character. Word Alive brings vibrant energy shaped by its many young people and its strong sense of community identity. The congregation’s Nigerian heritage deeply influences the community’s warmth and faith expression. Their commitment is evident in the long distances many travel each week to attend. The group also believe it is important not to hold communion in morning services, a practice they see as rooted in Scripture.

“St Andrew’s, by contrast, offers a historic and contemplative setting, with its altar, stained glass, and written liturgy giving a sense of sacred continuity. Its different service styles—Communion and the Service of the Word—offer varied expressions of worship. Deep links with

Boreham village, and international connections such as a partnership with Kenya, give St Andrew’s a strong sense of rootedness in place and story.

“Yet the group also recognised how much the churches hold in common. Both value warm relationships, outreach, evangelism, music that blends hymns with contemporary songs, and a shared commitment to the wellbeing of Boreham. Both also enjoy a degree of denominational flexibility and are eager to grow in friendship.

“A major idea emerging from the meeting was a potential summer concert - designed not as a fundraiser but as a relational, invitational event for the village. Hosting and invitations would be shared by the two congregations, with a joint planning group to take the idea forward.

“Other possibilities included a family evening for all ages, a monthly prayer gathering called Transforming Boreham, and even an “intermission” during joint services to encourage new friendships. The evening offered more than plans - it was a glimpse of what God can do when God’s people come together with humility, curiosity, and hope.”

# Rogation

*A reflection for Rogation from the Revd Canon Janet Nicholls, Diocesan Rural Adviser and Agricultural Chaplain*

Rogation is the second agricultural festival of the year. It is the festival that draws our eyes to the good earth. Although Rogation worship might take place in a church building, the associated activities such as Rogation walks, or "Beating the Bounds", happen outside. Very often, services are open-air too.

If you join a Rogation walk, you will probably be invited to stroll at a slower pace than usual so that you can tread gently and observe carefully as you go.

One of the routes I will walk this Rogation Sunday was flooded during the winter. The excessive rain of January and February saturated swathes of the agricultural land of our diocese. For long periods, our good fertile soil was underwater as the usual safe guards of rivers, ditches and drains were overwhelmed by the excessive rainfall. It was difficult to imagine that this saturated land could nurture growth in future seasons.

And yet, this Rogation Sunday, as our eyes focus on the land of our communities, we might

observe the miraculous signs of growth all around us. Acknowledging the land's gentle recovery from the harsh winter serves to deepen our thankfulness as we ask God's blessing on the emergent growth this Rogationtide.

As Agricultural Chaplain, I often observe how the "good soil" of our agricultural land reflects something of the "good soil" of our souls. Our God of Creation holds earth and humanity as one. This Rogationtide might speak especially to those whose hearts and souls are overwhelmed at present. It might remind us that with gentle patience, the season of overwhelm will pass and gradually our good soil will recover, guiding us into future seasons of growth and flourishing.



## Parish Giving Scheme enables generous giving at St Mary the Virgin Church in Shenfield

Although St Mary the Virgin, Shenfield is a large congregation located in a relatively affluent part of West Essex, the parish has faced financial challenges for many years. Recognising the need for change, the parish took decisive steps to strengthen its financial sustainability - placing the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) at the heart of this effort.

Churchwarden, James Anderson shares how the parish is successfully using the PGS to enable people in their church to give generously.

James writes: "Under the leadership of a new Rector in 2024, the PCC decided to make a concerted effort to repair our shaky finances. There were a number of actions we put in place around cost reduction, but we also realised we needed to grow our income substantially.

"We had used the PGS for quite a number of years, but giving had dropped off, and we had fewer than 100 regular givers on the scheme. We decided to make a concerted effort to improve that.

"We focused on a small number of key messages to communicate to the congregation and the wider church community:

- The financial challenge the church was facing would not go away and posed a significant threat to the church as a sole-occupancy parish.
- We were grateful for all giving, but strongly encouraged people to consider PGS.
- PGS offered important advantages over other forms of giving: for the church, a regular and

predictable income to enable better planning; for givers, the assurance that their donation went straight to the church with no commission, and that Gift Aid was handled automatically. Givers also retained full control over their donations.

- Signing up was easy. We placed cards with QR codes in every pew, displayed posters at the back of church, and emphasised that people could also sign up by email or telephone if they were less confident with technology.

"We communicated these messages through multiple channels: the church magazine, social media, and from the front of church in our regular services. We have continued to repeat them consistently for over a year now, and we also give updates on the progress we have made as the months have gone past.

"That progress has been absolutely fantastic! We have now doubled our number of givers to over 200, and the money we receive is nearly 70% up on two years ago. This has made huge inroads into the financial deficit and, alongside other- sometimes difficult - decisions we have made, gives us the real prospect of a financial surplus in 2026."

PGS manages regular Direct Debit and one-off giving and is designed to ease the administrative burden for churches. Our Parish Giving Advisers regularly run webinars to explain the PGS scheme. Scan the QR code to book for a future webinar.

## Called to Serve: Young Vocations

New video series to inspire and encourage young vocations across the Diocese of Chelmsford

The Diocese of Chelmsford has published the first video in a new series - Called to Serve: Young Vocations - created to inspire young people aged 18–32 as they explore their calling. For some, that call (or vocation) is a specific calling to licensed or ordained ministry. For others, it could mean serving God through faithful discipleship in their church community and everyday life.

The series features ministers in Chelmsford Diocese sharing their own vocations stories and the first video introduces the Revd Will Rose Moore, Curate at St John the Baptist Church in Loughton. Will shares his experience of responding to God's call, training as a young ordinand, and navigating his first year in ministry. He also offers encouragement to young people who think God might be calling them.

In his video Will says: "Sometimes I think we are waiting for a big sign, and actually, God's waiting for us. There's something about being active

in our calling. Yes, wait for God – and pray and reflect – but if you feel God has put something on your heart, go for it!"

Alongside the video series, a new young vocations page has been created on the diocesan website. This page brings together information about both lay and ordained ministry and will be home to all the Called to Serve videos as they are released.

For those ready to take the next step on their vocation journey, the webpage includes a short contact form. Once completed, a member of our Vocations Team will be in touch for an informal conversation about possible next steps.

Tayrina Ferguson, Vocations Outreach Officer for the Diocese of Chelmsford said: "We are entering an exciting time for younger Vocations across Chelmsford Diocese and there is a growing recognition that God calls each one of us; our job is to work out what to! God uses



prayers at events like Remembrance or at the scattering of ashes for one of the club chairmen who sadly died.

One of the areas of work that has developed over the last year is also being Chaplain to the supporters. I have worked closely with the club's Supporter Services department, have had fans reach out to me for bereavement support and have ministered at funerals for local supporters on behalf of the club.

Being Chaplain to West Ham United is a voluntary role but a role that the club takes seriously and I have access to some privileged areas. In hospital chaplaincy we consider the bedside to be Holy Ground, the chaplain doesn't bring God to the bedside, God is already there, the chaplain may become the conduit for God and the patients, but God is already at the bedside.

It's the same at the football club. I don't bring God along with me on a Friday morning when I visit, God is already there, I'm simply an access point between God and the players, staff and supporters.

Pastoral, spiritual and religious care is so important in all sports, just being around

people building relationships and helping them find their own answers to their own questions in life is vital. I affiliate to Sports Chaplaincy UK which has hundreds of chaplains registered and they do amazing work supporting sports chaplains and ministering through sport.

## Chaplaincy at West Ham United

### The club chaplain provides spiritual, pastoral and religious care to players, staff and supporters

The Revd Philip Wright writes about his ministry as Chaplain at West Ham United Football Club:

Being Chaplain to West Ham United Football Club is not only a privilege and an honour, it's also a coming home for me! I grew up in Rush Green, which is where the men's first team's training ground is situated, and I have supported West Ham all my life.

The club has had three club chaplains over the years - the Ven. Elwin Cockett was the first in the 90's and then the Revd Alan Bolding took over the role. I worked alongside Alan as the Academy Chaplain which I started in 2015 and when Alan retired, I became the main Club Chaplain. Like my full-time job as Lead Hospital Chaplain for Barking Havering & Redbridge

Hospital Trust, my role at the club is spiritual, pastoral and religious care, however, the majority of what I do is pastoral care.

During the week I visit the First Team training ground, Academy training ground and occasionally London Stadium where I chat with and support all involved with the club. I might be sitting with the players or having a coffee with the coaching staff or manager, or I might be walking the pitches with the ground staff.

I have had players chat to me about difficult decisions they have had to make or about their families and loved ones. I have supported staff who have been ill or their loved ones who have been sick. I have taken funerals and even baptised babies, and I have led services and



our talents and gifts in a wide variety of ways, from ordained and licensed ministry, to serving as churchwardens, school governors and everything in between! Part of the joy of working in vocations is sharing in the life-giving joy serving God brings."

### For churches

There are resources available on the new web page which parishes can use to help promote young vocations and The Called to Serve videos within their own church communities, if they would like to do so. These include a poster for church notice boards and a graphic to use on digital screens.

## St Luke's Church of England Primary School at heart of groundbreaking green community energy project

An innovative community energy project that generates green energy from an east London Church of England primary school and shares it with nearby homes has begun delivering its first power.

The pilot project by E.ON Next is designed to maximise the benefits of local solar generation and to make energy more affordable within communities - making cleaner power more accessible and affordable for all, while supporting the UK's net zero goals.

This first-of-its-kind initiative has seen E.ON Next fund and install more than 220 solar panels on St Luke's CEVA Primary School in Canning Town, east London. The school benefits from discounted electricity, with a portion of the power also shared to neighbours at a reduced price.

The project was formally launched in November 2025, with staff and pupils of St Luke's, along with a blessing by the Revd Amy Stott, the vicar of St Luke's Church.

Speaking at the launch of the project, Amy said: "It's so exciting to see this project come together. St Luke's Church and School is an amazing and unique community, and now it's great to also be part of this new generation of innovators and developers leading into this new technological revolution of seeing community buildings serving

the community even more. We are so grateful to E.ON for working with us to see our wonderful school and church become even more at the heart of serving Canning Town."

Also speaking at the launch, Carrie Prior, Chelmsford Diocesan Director of Education, said: "Today is about more than installing solar panels - it's about pioneering a new way of thinking, where schools and communities work together to care for creation and share energy for the common good."

## Bishop Guli's Easter message

*The Rt Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani, the Bishop of Chelmsford, has written a message for the Easter season:*

I've recently returned from another trip to Israel and Palestine to show solidarity with our Christian brothers and sisters who continue to live under intolerable conditions. In the West Bank, in particular, the increase in the number of checkpoints haphazardly and cruelly dominates daily life and the effect of unrestrained illegal settlements perpetuates violence against Palestinians, driving people from their homes. Communities are being decimated and prospects for a lasting and just peace for all seem bleaker than ever.

During my trip, I was asked to preach at St. Philip's Church in Nablus. But what to say to people living with such pain? I confess I found it quite a challenge. I offered them greetings from that other beleaguered Christian community close to my heart in Iran.

I spoke of Christian hope which persists even through the darkest times, and of the suffering which is at the heart of the Gospel in the way of the cross that Jesus walked. I spoke too of my solidarity and support in the ongoing cry for justice, also a Christian theme.

Finally, I reminded them (and all of us) to continue looking for the good, lest we be overwhelmed by the evil. For there is always goodness, even in the most vile situations. There is good in shared relationships, in small acts of kindness, courageous resistance, support given and received.

These are glimpses of God's love and presence. They are signs of resurrection – of the life that burst forth as Jesus emerged from the tomb on that first Easter and of resurrection life that still refuses to be subdued.

So, whatever your context and experiences, may God give you grace to continue looking for the good, strength to bear your suffering, and courage to continue speaking and working for justice.

I wish you a blessed and joyful Easter.

## Bishop Guli's Visit to Israel and Palestine

In late January, the Rt Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani, Bishop of Chelmsford, travelled with the bishops of Gloucester and Norwich to Israel and Palestine. The visit focused on the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, where they spent time with local Palestinian Christian communities and other groups, listening, sharing, and praying with them.

A day was spent with Father Fadi Diab, Anglican parish priest at St Andrew's, Ramallah. The bishops visited diocesan institutions including the Arab Evangelical School and the Vocational Training Centre. The Arab Evangelical School is the only diocesan school with a majority of Christian students. Its mission is rooted in serving the wider Palestinian community in all its diversity, welcoming students of any religion, race, gender, or socio-economic status.

Staff explained that increasing travel restrictions across the West Bank since the Hamas terrorist attacks of 7 October 2023 have made it more difficult for children and teachers to reach the school. They described a parent's decision to invest in their child's education as a form of resistance. Although "hope" is spoken of mainly at Easter, they said it is practiced daily. Supporting students' emotional and psychological wellbeing is a central priority, with

counsellors available to help children navigate the ongoing trauma of living under occupation.

The bishops then visited the neighbouring parish of St Peter's, Birzeit, where they met Lulu and Sammi Nassir. Their daughter, Layan, aged 25, is serving an eight month sentence in an Israeli prison. She was first arrested in 2021, allegedly for supporting a student-led union, the Democratic Progressive Student Pole, which an Israeli military order later deemed illegal. She is due to be released on in May 2026, when she is expected to resume her work with the YMCA.

Bishop Guli said, "I continue to pray for Layan daily and have had a candle burning in my small chapel at Bishops Court which will stay alight until she is released."

Other stops on the trip included a visit to the Old City of Nablus, accompanied by representatives of SEEDS, a cultural and educational NGO supporting youth, children, and women; and joining Archbishop Hosam in a service at St George's Cathedral in Jerusalem to mark the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

**St Nicholas' C of E Primary School pupil presented with High Sheriff's Award**

The Revd Canon Janet Nicholls, Chelmsford Diocese Rural Adviser and Agricultural Chaplain, joined the High Sheriff of Essex, Julie Fosh, on a visit to St Nicholas' C of E Primary School in Rayleigh to present a pupil with a prestigious award.

Nine year old James Matthews, the son of a local farming family, received a High Sheriff's Certificate for Outstanding Achievement in recognition of his remarkable fundraising efforts for the Christian farming charity, the Farming Community Network (FCN). At the end of last year, James climbed Ben Nevis to raise funds and awareness for the organisation.

Sharing James' story, the Revd Canon Janet Nicholls writes: "I recently accompanied the High Sheriff of Essex to St Nicholas' C of E Primary School in Rayleigh, where James was presented with a High Sheriff's Certificate for his outstanding achievement.

"In 2021, aged 5, James underwent surgery to create an artificial anterior cruciate ligament and from then on has turned his rehabilitation into something extraordinary, fundraising through walks and climbs. Climbing Britain's highest mountain on his knee, which doctors rebuilt from scratch, has been his toughest challenge yet.

"As fifth generation of a farming family in Battlesbridge, James was particularly keen to raise awareness of the support available to the farming community via FCN. James aimed to raise £500 for FCN and has exceeded this three-fold, raising £1600 so far!"

## Chrishall Pupils Shine on Stage with iSingPOP

In the space of just a few days, pupils at Chrishall Primary School experienced an extraordinary transformation thanks to a visit from the iSingPOP team just before Christmas. What began as an ordinary, dark Monday morning became a sparkling Thursday afternoon performance.

iSingPOP, run by the UK-based Christian charity Innervation Trust, works in official partnership with the Church of England. The project helps children and families explore collective worship through vibrant music, energetic dancing and joyful singing.

Hannah and Kirsty from iSingPOP visited the school and taught the children a series of songs complete with upbeat choreography. The pupils rose to the challenge and were soon performance ready.

The Revd James Webster, Rector of the Icknield Way Parish, commented: "The fact that most of the children chose to perform at both concerts - the second one being entirely voluntary - speaks volumes about how engaged they were and how much they loved the experience. The audiences loved it too!"

Building on the momentum, the Icknield Way Parish hosted its first iSingSaturday at the end of January. This child-led, family-focused worship event began with food, drinks and craft activities, creating a warm and welcoming atmosphere. The worship that followed centred on familiar iSingPOP songs, a couple of new songs, an exploration of a Bible story, and some children's prayers.

Reflecting on the event's impact, Revd James added: "We had just over 40 people attend - a mix of children and adults - with only one family being regular churchgoers. The children loved it, and one dad said, 'I never come to church because I don't feel comfortable - but I like this.'"

With such enthusiastic feedback from families and children alike, iSingPOP has clearly struck a chord in the community, one that the parish hopes to continue with future events.

## The Porch Pantry at West Mersea

Tucked into the porch of St Peter & St Paul's Parish Church in West Mersea, the Porch Pantry has been supporting the local community for nearly seven years. Launched in the summer of 2018, it had a simple aim: to support local families who relied on free school meals and were struggling during the school holidays.

Very quickly, its volunteers realised that the need reached far beyond school holiday pressures.

Volunteer, Emma Cornwell, who runs the Porch Pantry, explains: "We quickly realised that the need was much greater. Over the years it has become clear that any one of us may need its support. We never know what life may throw at us."

"Even the most secure job can end with just a month's notice. An unexpected vet's bill or car repair can throw off even the most careful budgeting. And for victims of domestic abuse, life often involves choices that are no choices at all. Controlling and coercive behaviour is very real in our communities."

The pantry operates with a deeply rooted principle of no judgement.

Emma continues: "None of us know what goes on behind closed doors. Irrespective of how people 'present' - how big their house is, or what car they drive.

"Our faith guides us and teaches us not to judge others. Mersea is a truly unique community, always ready to step up to support."

The Porch Pantry receives financial donations from Essex and Local Councils, from individuals, and from charities, clubs and societies across Mersea. This generosity helps keep the pantry stocked with essentials as well as seasonal items. The pantry recently received a donation of Easter eggs to share with families this Easter.

Emma's work at the Porch Pantry was recognised more widely when she was nominated last year in the Volunteer category of the BBC Essex Make a Difference Awards.

"It was hugely humbling to be nominated. I went with my husband Aaron and my parents. We enjoyed an amazing evening at Hatfield Place, hearing incredible stories of community engagement," said Emma.

Emma's nomination reflects not only her own commitment, but also the collective effort of volunteers and donors who ensure the Porch Pantry remains a beacon of hope for anyone in the community facing a difficult time.
