Harlow Deanery Vision Day

Clergy and lay representatives from Harlow Deanery Synod recently came together for a vision day at the Emmaus Centre, Thorley. The day was facilitated by the Revd Andy Griffiths, Lead Adviser for Wellbeing and Formation and Continuing Ministerial Development Adviser.

Drawing on passages from John 1 and Acts 10, participants reflected together on God's calling and explored a shared vision for the deanery.

The Revd Andy Griffiths said: "I really enjoyed joining the Harlow Deanery for this vision day. There was real energy in the room as we reflected on the Holy Spirit, who descends like a dove, and sought to put into words the desires God has placed on our hearts."

"People contributed in a variety of ways, from creative artwork featuring a rainbow-decorated elephant and an ostrich, to what one participant described as a vision from God of the Bayeux Tapestry, alongside thoughtful discussion and generous encouragement."

"Together, we discovered a desire to be a deanery that is Jesus-centred and open to the leading of the Holy Spirit, even when that means being lovingly nudged, stretched or surprised. Prayer lies at the heart of this vision, alongside a commitment to mutual care, togetherness, and collaboration."

"Like a family of elephants gathering to protect

one another, the deanery longs to share gifts, wisdom, experience and resources generously, with a sense of subsidiarity – where decisions are made as close to the local context as possible. Ministers and churches should be able to say, 'I'm glad I'm part of this deanery. It helps me.'"

The vision that emerged emphasised supporting churches through both the joys and challenges, reducing unnecessary burdens, and creating an environment where disciples can flourish and grow.

The Revd Darren McIndoe, Area Dean of Harlow, added: "The passages we reflected on reminded us that God lives in and works through ordinary people like us, and that we are called to listen for the prompting of the Holy Spirit. They encouraged us to minister wherever God leads us and never to turn away from those whom God is calling us to love into his Kingdom."

"The vision day provided an opportunity to celebrate the rich diversity of our deanery. Our variety is one of our strengths, but we were also reminded of the importance of working together. By supporting one another, we can strengthen every parish and better serve our communities."

Pray for our churches and worshipping communities across Harlow Deanery as they seek to follow the Holy Spirit, grow in unity, and support one another in serving their local communities.

Let Justice Roll Down Like Waters

A reflection from The Very Revd Dr Jessica Martin, The Dean of Chelmsford:

As I write, the grass is dead. It is hot. Wildfires rage in France, Spain, Greece. The little 'rain' icon on my phone endlessly recedes: 35% chance next Tuesday, next Friday, towards the end of the following week.

In you is the well of life, wrote the psalmist in Psalm 36. In a world where water suddenly seems scarce, its life-giving properties become miraculous: the precious nature of running water (for 'living water' is also a way of describing water that flows rather than pools) in a dry country upends our sense of what is valuable.

In psalm 84, in the beautiful translation by Coverdale, the psalmist speaks of the person who 'going through the vale of misery uses it for a well; and the pools are filled with water'.

We know that our extreme weather is a consequence of human-made climate change. We have brought upon ourselves the extremities of heat and of flood, of wind and of scorching sun. The delicate ecological niche in which we, and countless species besides, flourished

in complex interdependence, has been destabilised by our unchecked desire to take up more and more space. In climate terms, we are like the rich in Amos's prophecy, who flourish by grabbing from those around them.

'Let justice roll down like rivers,' he writes, 'and righteousness like a never-failing stream'. The good things of the earth are not exploitable resources, but gifts from God, generosity that begets generosity, so that as we receive, so we learn to give onwards.

As we approach the Season of Creation, may we honour the gifts God gives us by conserving and handing on a more hospitable world to those who come after.

For all things comes from you (as Solomon prayed over his gifts) and of your own do we give you.

Harvest 2026

A reflection from The Revd Canon Janet Nicholls, Rural Adviser & Agricultural Chaplain:

Over the next few weeks, many of our churches will be offering Harvest Festivals. In a diocese of extensive agricultural land, Harvest Festival provides the opportunity to connect with the people who dedicate their lives to ensuring that food is produced to nourish and sustain us.

Bringing crops to harvest in 2026, has required incredible expertise and commitment. The very wet winter followed by an excessively dry spring and extremely hot summer have provided challenging growing conditions. Every crop brought to fruition this year has been something of a triumph. Each time I saw a combine harvester cutting wheat this harvest, I felt truly thankful that our farmers had managed to add to the reserves of this essential crop.

Globally, wheat continues to be the staple food for around 3 billion people of whom more than a third are among the poorest, and it provides approximately one fifth of the calories and protein of the human diet. The wheat in our diocese is often grown in environmentally-friendly ways including zero-till systems to maintain soil structure and store carbon, with

reduced herbicides and fungicides, and in settings where biodiversity is encouraged through maintaining hedgerows and allowing wide field-margins (providing "Wildlife Motorways" around the farm!).

Times remain tough in agriculture. As Agricultural Chaplain, I'm mindful of the sacrifices made by many in our farming community as they aim to provide us with a consistent and safe supply of food, whilst treading lightly on the earth.

Over the last eleven years, it has been my honour and privilege to affirm, support and pray for them. I extend a very warm invitation to everyone to join me in this endeavour as we give thanks for this year's harvest in prayer and praise at our **Essex County Harvest Service in Chelmsford Cathedral on Sunday 27th September at 3.30pm**. Tractors and animals will be present!

Pray for all those who work in agriculture across our diocese and beyond. We give thanks for their skill, resilience and dedication in bringing food from field to plate, often in challenging conditions.

The Revd Dr Chris Szejnmann, Vicar of Holy Trinity, Barkingside, reflects: "Our amazing Community Summer Garden Party is what a 'Neighbourhood of Solidarity and Love' looks like for us at Holy Trinity Barkingside. It was a wonderful celebration of people of all ages and backgrounds - our Vicarage Garden was heaving with joy and laughter.

"At a time when we are challenged daily by violence, hatred and exclusion, alongside an ever-deepening cost of living crisis, our vision is to bring the community together in solidarity and love and to build a welcoming, diverse, inclusive, family-friendly, lively and creative church for

This vision has helped bring together people of all backgrounds, all faiths and none, through church activities including baby and toddler groups, youth clubs and salsa classes. Relationships with other faith communities, particularly Jewish and Muslim neighbours, continue to grow, alongside partnerships with local councillors, the police and other community organisations.

Many of these groups joined the Community Summer Garden Party, creating a powerful example of shared celebration and community spirit - showing how God's love and generosity are at work within the local community.

Chris added: "This was such a wonderful image of God's abundance around us. It encouraged us to continue awakening the unique gifts and power of people, families and our neighbourhood, and to keep building a community rooted in solidarity and love in these challenging times."

Diocesan Celebration of Lay Ministry

This year's Diocesan Lay Ministry Celebration Service took place on Sunday 5 July at Chelmsford Cathedral.

The service – led by The Right Reverend Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani, the Bishop of Chelmsford was an opportunity for us to gather as a Diocese and celebrate the variety of Lay Ministries in our places of worship, communities and schools across Essex and East London.

The preacher was Canon Caroline Harding, Diocesan Lay Ministry Adviser, Warden of Readers and Licensed Lay Minister (LLM) in the Harlow deanery.

During the service Bishop Guli licensed a new LLM - Nicky Sirett who will serve at St John the Evangelist, Colchester.

LLMs are theologically trained, and their role involves working alongside ordained ministers and other lay leaders in their church community. They have a leadership role and can use their leadership skills in a variety of ways, as an adult educator – training or mentoring other lay ministries, focusing Christian nurture or as someone who attends to the connection between faith and daily life.

New Pastoral Assistants and Spiritual Companions were also authorised at the service.

Pastoral Assistants offer pastoral care in the church and wider community. They are people who have a passion for communicating the message of Christ to others through caring action.

Spiritual Companions are trained, authorised

Anglicans who meet with others to listen attentively, help them discern God's guidance and encourage them in their journey of prayer and faith. Some are lay and some are ordained.

Speaking ahead of the service, Bishop Guli said: "Our annual Lay Ministry Celebration is a wonderful opportunity to come together as a diocesan family and give thanks for the many people who faithfully serve God and their church communities through a variety of lay ministries.

"It is a particular joy this year to license Nicky as a new Lay Minister, and to authorise our new Pastoral Assistants and Spiritual Companions. I am deeply grateful for the commitment, gifts and dedication that they each bring.

"Please join me in praying for them as they begin their new ministries."

Canon Caroline added: "The ministry of lay ministers is part of the lifeblood of our Church, and without the vital part they play, the Church could not carry out God's Mission: to make the Gospel known through our words and actions, and to help realise the Kingdom of God here on earth.

"Our Diocesan Lay Ministry Celebration Service is a wonderful opportunity to come together and pray for all lay ministries, giving thanks for the dedicated service of so many volunteers."

The Revd Ben King completes Three Peaks Challenge to celebrate 140 years of St Mark's

St Mark's, Forest Gate, celebrates its 140th anniversary this year, and the church community has been keen to mark this significant milestone. To commemorate the occasion, the Revd Ben King, Vicar of St Mark's, took on the Three Peaks Challenge to raise funds in support of the life and mission of the parish.

In May, Ben completed the iconic challenge which involves climbing Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike and Snowdon - the three highest peaks in Scotland, England and Wales - within 24 hours.

Ben said: "I'd heard of the Three Peaks Challenge and resolved that this would be a good way of celebrating 140 years by raising funds to help resource our mission and ministry for the next 140 years.

"I'm glad to say that with the loving support and prayers of many at St Mark's and beyond, I completed the challenge at the end of May, with just seven minutes to spare!

"I felt wonderfully upheld and sustained by God every step of the way and am also grateful for the number of incredible opportunities I had to witness about Jesus to other members of my

team. To be honest, it felt more of a spiritual adventure than it did a physical challenge.

‘Called As We Are’ Exhibition Coming to Chelmsford Cathedral

Chelmsford Cathedral will host Called As We Are, a powerful exhibition of twelve portraits celebrating the life and witness of disabled, deaf and neurodivergent people who minister and work in the Church of England.

Featuring twelve portraits by documentary and portrait photographer Ruth Samuels, the exhibition was launched at York Minster in July and is now touring four Church of England cathedrals, including Chelmsford Cathedral.

The exhibition will be on display at Chelmsford Cathedral from 12 October to 9 November, before concluding its national tour at St Giles’ Church, Cripplegate, London, in February 2026.

Each portrait is accompanied by personal reflections from those featured, sharing their experiences of disability and neurodivergence, their journeys of faith, and the adjustments and support that have enabled them to flourish in ministry. Audio descriptions and British Sign Language (BSL) interpretation are also available.

Helen James, who features in the exhibition, and oversees The Church of England’s Disability Project, said: “There are many deaf, disabled and neurodivergent priests and ministers living and proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ, but often this is unseen or unrecognised as a gift to the church.

“Disability, neurodivergence and difference are all part of what it means to be human, to be members of the ‘human race’ who are created to reflect the image of God. The breadth and diversity of the human experience leads us to understand more of the breadth and diversity of the God we worship and whose image we reflect.”

The Revd John Saxon, Disabilities’ Adviser for Chelmsford Diocese said: “I’m delighted that the ‘Called as we are’ exhibition is coming to Chelmsford Cathedral. The exhibition is a powerful reminder that everyone has a place in the life and ministry of the Church. It celebrates the truth that God calls each and every one of us, with our unique gifts and experiences, just as we are. Being inclusive is not just about welcoming everyone to sit with us in the pews, it is also opening the pulpit, altar table and rectory study to all whom, following exploration and discernment, are authorised to such ministry’.

Following God's Call: Andy's Journey to ordination



After first sensing a call to ordained ministry over 15 years ago, Andy Mussell is now one of 15 new deacons to be ordained at Chelmsford Cathedral on 13 September. Following his ordination, he will serve at All Saints, Springfield. In this reflection, Andy shares the story of his faith journey.

"My Christian journey began in childhood. I grew up in a Methodist family, and my brother and I attended Sunday school regularly. Church was an important part of our early lives, but as I grew older and my circumstances changed, attending worship gradually became less frequent.

"Everything changed in 2011 when I was invited to a special centenary service at my local Methodist church - the same church where my mother had worshipped for many years. The preacher was the Revd Martin Turner from Westminster Central Hall, whose sermon was based on Romans 8. As he spoke about the forgiveness that is ours through Christ, I felt as though his words were directed personally to me. In that moment, I understood why I was there. The burden of guilt and suffering that I had carried was lifted, and I experienced God's grace in a profound way.

"From that day, the hymn 'And Can It Be' took on a deeply personal meaning, expressing my own experience of God's transforming love. On

6 March 2011, I gave my life to Christ, and within a few weeks I sensed a clear and compelling call to ordained ministry. I began five years of training within the Methodist Church and, on completion, served in the Chelmsford Circuit. For many years I believed that my vocation would be fulfilled through ordained ministry in the Methodist Church. However, after a prayerful period of discernment, I was led to the Church of England in 2019. Now, fifteen years after first sensing God's call, I am preparing for ordination with deep gratitude and humility.

"Throughout this journey, I have been blessed by the many people I have had the privilege to meet, serve, and learn from. I am especially grateful to my wife, whose steadfast love, encouragement, and unwavering support have sustained me every step of the way.

"As I look back, I will always cherish the place where my faith began and my calling first took root. I do so with gratitude and affection. As I look ahead, I do so with hope and anticipation, giving thanks to God for His unfailing grace, mercy, and faithfulness, and praying that I may continue to serve him faithfully in the service of others."

Lichfield stone to become lasting symbol of faith and shared heritage at Bradwell Chapel

The Bishop of Chelmsford, the Rt Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani, and the Dean of Chelmsford, the Very Revd Dr Jessica Martin, recently travelled to Lichfield Cathedral to collect a stone that will become part of the altar at St Peter's Chapel, Bradwell-on-Sea.

Their visit on Friday 11 June followed a commission given at the close of the 2025 Bradwell Pilgrimage – to bring a stone back to Essex from one of Lichfield Cathedral's spires.

While in Lichfield, Bishop Guli and Dean Jessica were welcomed by the Bishop of Lichfield, the Rt Revd Dr Michael Igrave, and Canon Chancellor, the Revd Canon Dr Gregory Platten. Together they celebrated the Eucharist and Bishop Michael blessed the stone before it began its journey to Chelmsford Diocese.

The stone was consecrated at this year's Bradwell Pilgrimage in July, which was themed "Living Stones". The stone will be placed within the altar at St Peter's Chapel as a lasting symbol of the connection between the dioceses of Lichfield and Chelmsford.

The connection has its roots in the seventh century, when Cedd and his brother Chad studied together in the monastery school of Lindisfarne. Cedd became a leading missionary bishop of that era, and he was first assigned a mission in the Midlands. Later, he led the mission to the East Saxons, and he built the chapel of St Peter-on-the-Wall at Bradwell-on-Sea around 654AD, while Chad later became Bishop of Lichfield.

Dean Jessica, said: "Visiting Lichfield and meeting Bishop Michael and Canon Gregory was a real joy, and a reminder that the connection between our two dioceses is not simply a piece of ancient history we carry around with us.

"Cedd and Chad were brothers shaped by the same faith and the same calling, sent in different directions to serve different people and in some sense, Chelmsford and Lichfield still are. Embedding this stone in the altar at Bradwell feels like the right way to mark that: a small, permanent sign that these stories belong together."

Count on Nature: Uncovering the Fascinating World of Moths at St Mary's

Churchyards are places of peace and reflection, but they are also havens for wildlife. In June, as part of the national Love Your Burial Ground Week and Churches Count on Nature 2026, a group gathered in the churchyard of St Mary's Church in Stebbing to explore the fascinating world of moths.

The moths had been safely trapped overnight using specialist equipment designed to attract them without causing harm. On the morning of the event, they were carefully examined and recorded before being released back into their natural habitat. Participants were able to discover and learn more about the variety of species living within the churchyard.

The event was led by ecologist Richard Wren, alongside fellow moth enthusiast Kate Smith.

The Revd Sue Hurley, Vicar at St Mary's, said: "Richard demonstrated the specialist traps used to attract moths, complete with egg cartons, and shared fascinating insights into some of the species we discovered, including the striking Elephant Hawk-moth. Kate had also set her own traps and brought along additional specimens in viewing containers.

"We were treated to an unexpected variety of moths, each with beautiful colours, intricate patterns, remarkable camouflage and unique characteristics. It was a wonderful opportunity to learn about just a small fraction of the approximately 2,500 moth species found in the UK.

"This event, held as part of Churches Count on Nature, was a wonderful reminder that even familiar places can be home to an astonishing diversity of wildlife, just waiting to be discovered."

Love Your Burial Ground Week is held annually to celebrate churchyards, chapel yards and cemeteries as places of heritage, community and nature. Churches Count on Nature - supported by Caring for God's Acre, the Church of England, the Church in Wales and A Rocha UK- which forms part of the week, encourages local communities to explore, record and celebrate the wildlife found in churchyards.

Abundant Bradwell

In June this year, the Church of England Strategic Mission and Ministry Investment Board (SMMIB) committed funds to support mission in the Bradwell Episcopal Area of South Essex.

Overall, £5.2m has been committed through the Diocesan Investment Programme, an initial £1.6 million with a further £3.6 million agreed in principle. This funding will support Abundant Bradwell, a missional plan developed in partnership with local church leaders and volunteers across the Bradwell Area of Chelmsford Diocese.

Abundant Bradwell seeks to resource and strengthen parishes across the Episcopal Area, holding a vision for the area as a whole, with some projects supported by national funding. Reflecting the Diocese of Chelmsford's direction of travel and shared values- Travelling Well Together - the plan has been shaped collaboratively in response to locally discerned needs and opportunities.

It focuses on four key areas:

- Helping churches and chaplaincies to flourish abundantly as the people and communities God calls them to be
- Enabling and empowering people to flourish in ministry and daily life
- Supporting significant growth in engagement with children and young people
- Focusing on renewed worship and confident discipleship

The initial tranche of funding will support the development of specific church revitalisation among a network of churches in Southend. It builds on growing congregations and work with young people and draws on planting experience in parts of the diverse Southend Deanery. It will also expand work among the LGBTQI+ community. This builds on an existing chaplaincy and reflects a broader vision of welcome,

belonging and growth in Christ in an area where this is an expressed need.

From 2026–2028, a further £3.6 million has been agreed in principle.* This will support outward-looking church renewal, including revitalisation projects in the most densely populated areas of the city of Chelmsford. This following phase will further strengthen parish renewal more broadly across the area, including leadership development, rural ministry, and work with children and young people.

Looking ahead, in 2029, the Bradwell Episcopal Area intends to submit a further bid of up to £7.8m, focusing on Basildon and Thurrock, two areas with significant and growing populations and historic under-investment in its churches.

Bradwell is the second Episcopal Area in The Diocese of Chelmsford to receive investment from SMMIB, following Barking's successful application to support the Believing in Barking missional plan. An application is also in development for the Colchester Episcopal Area.

Welcoming the news, the Bishop of Bradwell, the Rt Revd Adam Atkinson, said: "It is deeply

encouraging to receive this investment, and we give thanks to God for the opportunity it brings.

"We are grateful to the Church of England's Strategic Mission and Ministry Investment Board, and to the Vision and Strategy Team and our diocesan colleagues, for their support and dedication in enabling this work. We trust that it will bear abundant fruit by the power of the Holy Spirit among our beautifully diverse communities in South Essex. These are places rich in life, culture and possibility, marked by very different challenges yet all under the Lord's loving gaze.

"We are especially thankful to the local churches, clergy, lay leaders and volunteers - whose faithful discernment and commitment continues to shape the vision.

"This investment is one expression of a wider strategic approach called 'Abundant Bradwell'. Through it, we seek to grow a culture of mutual support and shared mission, trusting that God is already at work among us and inviting every community in Bradwell into fullness of life in Christ."

Chaplaincy to 16 Air Assault Brigade: Providing Pastoral, Spiritual and Moral Care

Since 2001, 16 Air Assault Brigade has been based in Colchester, building strong ties with the city and its communities. These links were celebrated in July 2026 at the dedication of the Colchester Airborne Soldier Statue, marking the Brigade's long-standing presence in the city.

As the British Army's Global Response Force, the Brigade is held at very high readiness to respond rapidly to crises worldwide. Its personnel are supported by a dedicated chaplaincy team.

The Revd Gavin Smith CF, Senior Chaplain to Brigade Headquarters, explains the role and ministry of the team:

"I lead chaplains who provide pastoral, spiritual and moral care to Brigade units. Most are based in Colchester, alongside Brigade Headquarters, Colchester Garrison, and the Military Correction and Training Centre, where service personnel undertake corrective training following periods of detention.

"Other Brigade locations include Woodbridge in Suffolk, Tern Hill in Shropshire, Shorncliffe in Kent and Brunei. A reservist unit has locations across England, Scotland and Wales. The team is also supported by an Officiating Chaplain to the Military, the Revd Kirsty Emerson, who serves in the Diocese of Chelmsford's Harwich Team

Ministry. She is chaplain to the Royal Military Police and other detachments in Colchester. The Diocese further showed its commitment to the military and veteran community by signing the Armed Forces Covenant in June 2026. (see page 38).

"The Royal Army Chaplains' Department exists to care for the Army's people and their families, offering pastoral, spiritual and moral support at home and overseas. This year, Brigade chaplains have deployed, or will deploy, to France, Kenya, Cyprus, the Falkland Islands, the Netherlands and Germany for exercises and commemorations, including events linked to the Normandy landings and the Battle of Arnhem.

"We are working on how best to prepare the Brigade for the ethical, psychological and spiritual challenges of the modern battlefield. Chaplains currently lead Moral Resilience seminars, helping service personnel define virtues such as courage and loyalty so they are better equipped to make the right choice in difficult and arduous situations."

From Compliance to Culture: How the Parish Safeguarding Dashboard is Supporting Our Churches

In June 2025, the Parish Safeguarding Dashboard was launched across Chelmsford Diocese, providing parishes with a simple, user-friendly online tool to help keep track of safeguarding administration and stay up to date with local and national safeguarding requirements.

The Dashboard supports parishes in monitoring and recording key safeguarding activities, while also helping them assess their progress against the Church of England's five National Safeguarding Standards.

The Parish Safeguarding Dashboard has been rolled out across most dioceses in the Church of England, and Chelmsford Diocese has achieved one of the fastest sign-up rates in the country.

Graeme Eyre, Parish Safeguarding Officer for St Thomas, Bradwell-on-Sea and St James, Dengie, has been using the Dashboard since July 2025 and has found it hugely beneficial.

Graeme explains: "As the Parish Safeguarding Officer for two rural parishes, I have found the Parish Safeguarding Dashboard an incredibly useful tool for structuring and supporting our safeguarding work.

"Both parishes are at slightly different stages, but the Dashboard takes account of that. Registering was straightforward, and it was easy to give access to the Churchwarden and Vicar so that we could all see progress and work collaboratively.

"The Dashboard enabled me to quickly record the safeguarding measures we already had in place, while also providing a clear action plan for areas where further development was needed. One of the things I have found particularly valuable is the way it has helped focus discussions at PCC meetings. Safeguarding is always a standing agenda item, but the Dashboard has moved conversations beyond simply reporting that there is nothing new to discuss or reminding PCC members to complete their training.

"We have also used one of the "Promoting a Healthier Culture" worksheets available through the Dashboard to help shape wider discussions at a PCC away day. I would strongly encourage any parish that has not yet started using the Dashboard to do so. It helps shift safeguarding purely from just a check list to something that permeates the culture of the parish."

Every parish in the Diocese of Chelmsford is required to use the Dashboard to track their progress in all areas of safeguarding. Encouragingly, 92% of our parishes are already actively using the system.

Harwich Deanery Outreach at the Tendring Show

Each year, the Tendring Show welcomes around 20,000 visitors from across Essex, bringing together rural and urban communities for a celebration of agriculture, local business and family activities. For many years, the churches of Harwich Deanery have been a valued part of the event, offering a welcoming space where people can pause and find refreshment amid the bustle of the showground.

The Harwich Deanery Churches Tent provides free refreshments, conversation and a listening ear throughout the day, alongside a baby changing and feeding area that is particularly appreciated by families.

This year, more than 100 children took part in craft activities. Families explored the theme of the Beatitudes, with children adding thumbprints to a collaborative Sermon on the Mount picture. More than 100 goody bags containing prayer cards, crosses and information about local churches were also given away.

Reflecting on this year's event, the Area Dean of Harwich, the Revd John Saxon, said: "The Tendring Show gives our churches a wonderful opportunity to serve the wider community in a simple and practical way. Visitors are often surprised that all hospitality is provided free of charge. Whether through offering hospitality,

supporting families, listening, praying or sharing something of our faith, we hope visitors experience the love and welcome of the Church."

Rural Adviser and Agricultural Chaplain, the Revd Canon Janet Nicholls added, "It is always a pleasure to visit the Harwich Deanery Churches Tent at the Tendring Show. The warm welcome, kind hospitality and prayerful presence amidst the busyness of the showground are reminders of how our churches so often bring 'salt, light and yeast' to the heart of our rural communities."

This presence has been supported in recent years through the Deanery Mission Opportunity Fund, enabling investment in resources including professional publicity materials, a gazebo and a generator, enabling the serving of hot drinks. These resources are now used at other community events - Christmas markets, sea shanty festivals and village fetes - helping Harwich churches to maintain a visible and welcoming presence across the deanery.

The Revd John Saxon also noted that improved publicity has helped increase attendance at local church services. The Deanery is already looking forward to returning to the Tendring Show on 10 July 2027.
